Here is the story of David and Goliath as found in in 1 Samuel 17:38-42, 48-51 "<sup>38</sup> So Saul clothed David with his armor, and he put a bronze helmet on his head; he also clothed him with a coat of mail. <sup>39</sup> David fastened his sword to his armor and tried to walk, for he had not tested them. And David said to Saul, "I cannot walk with these, for I have not tested them." So David took them off. <sup>40</sup> Then he took his staff in his hand; and he chose for himself five smooth stones from the brook, and put them in a shepherd's bag, in a pouch which he had, and his sling was in his hand. Once upon a time, the New Church of Montgomery was really in Montgomery, on East Kemper Road not too far east of Montgomery Road. However, even before that, with the church in the same spot, it was Montgomery that wasn't there. The church was in Loveland. That was as planned, it was told, because Loveland just sounded right for where our church should be. The property was picked out sometime after the church at Oak and Winslow was taken by eminent domain for the construction of Interstate 75. The church thrived in the new location, had quite a few kids, and some of our



current members still recall the Sunday School. A favorite curriculum was based on each week being themed according to the alphabet, with a Sunday for "Angels," then "Beauty,", and so on. The kids painted T—shirts with pictures of a mouse and their class name, the "Kemper Rodents", appropriate for a church on Kemper Road. Quite a few field trips were taken with the class decked out in their posh uniforms. A pleasant memory from the '70s.
